# **Duffel Bags for Foster Kids**

Foster kids often arrive at their new foster home with all of their property in a plastic trash bag or paper bags. This is the only way they are able to transport their meager belongings.

This year we plan to fill duffel bags with items that will provide some comfort as well give the children somewhere to store some of their things. We are asking your help to make this a successful endeavor. We plan to present these bags to Benchmark Services, which administers the foster care program, at their Christmas party in December. A duffel bag will then be given to each child who enters the foster care program.

It is estimated that each bag will cost \$20 filled. We plan to fill the bags with a blanket, stuffed animal, personal hygiene products, and a journal with pen or coloring book and crayons.

More great music is coming to Grace Fellowship Hall in October. Pianist Hongling Liang and cellist Ina Petkova-Apostolova will perform cello sonatas by Beethoven and Brahms in the second edition of the UU Columbus Concert Series. The free concert, open to the Public will be Sunday, October 15, at 4:30 p.m. at Grace Fellowship Hall. (Free will offerings will be gratefully accepted.)

Both performers are Artist Diploma students in the Schwob School of Music at CSU.

Hongling Liang, our regular UU accompanist is a prize-winning pianist well known to our Fellowship. She's an experienced soloist, accompanist and chamber musician. Born in Jilin, China, Hongling earned a Bachelor's degree in piano performance at Jinan University and Master's degree at Bard College's Longy School of Music in Boston. In the United States, Hongling has studied with renowned pianists Peter Serkin and Alexander Kobrin. At the Schwob School, she is studying with Eric Zuber.

Ina Petkova-Apostolova was born in Russia, but she grew up in Bulgaria and graduated from the National High School of Music in Sofia. She continued her Bachelor's and Master's degree studies in Austria at the Vienna Conservatory. Ina also studied in Paris and in Lausanne, Switzerland before enrolling at the Schwob School, where she studies with Wendy Warner. Like Hongling, Ina has won national and international competitions, and she recently performed with the Radio Symphony Orchestra of Vienna at the famed Vienna Konserthauss.

Hongling and Ina will play Ludwig von Beethoven's second Cello Sonata No. 3 in A major, Op. 69 (1808) and Johannes Brahms' Cello Sonata No. 2 in F major, Op.99 (1886).
