UU Update:



The words "Reason, Tolerance, Freedom" have been highlighted and a handrail has been installed on the wall behind the dais. New windows have also been installed and should provide better energy efficiency. The cap (top) of GFH has been painted and the fire escape has been cleaned and primed for painting. The exterior of the Meeting House is almost all painted.

Next on the agenda: The two air conditioning/heating units on the tower in back of the blue building are being replaced and the new units will be at ground level so the tower can be removed. Several generous donors are making this possible. This should also be an energy saver and reduce heating/cooling costs.

We hope to repair the exterior Masterwall (stucco), trim out the windows and paint the exterior of both the two story building and the blue building soon. The Design Team has met with our architect and has a blueprint ready to get bids from contractors for the front of GFH. Long range plans are to construct a new extended stoop and portico. The blueprint will be displayed at GFH and members will have an opportunity to vote on the final plans. Donations will be needed to make all of this a reality.

Bits and Pieces:

Our Children's RE program will be suspended for the months of July and August, but will resume in September. Child care will still be provided from 9:30 until noon each Sunday in July and August for children between the ages of 2 and 10. Volunteers are needed to read the Children's Story each Sunday. Books are provided. There is a sign up sheet on the bulletin board or you can let Kayla or Brenda know.
