- \* Fall Equinox begins on Saturday, 22 September, but we will have a pre-Fall Equinox celebration on Wednesday, 19 September in the Meditation Garden. The grill will fire up at 6 P.M. and the celebrations begin at 7:00. Bring food to cook or eat and your own libations. In the Wiccan and Pagan calendars, this is Mabon, which starts on Friday, 21 September. There are two themes for this celebration: the shifting from light to dark, and the second harvest. In case of inclement weather, we will gather at the Meeting House. Our inclement weather has usually been in the form of thunderstorms, and the associated lightning makes the pavilion less safe of a meeting site.

The UU Water Ceremony was first used at a UU worship service in the 1980's. Many UU Congregations now hold a Water Ceremony once a year, often at the beginning of a new church year. Our ceremony will be held September 9th.

Members bring to the service a small amount of water from a place that is special to them. During the appointed time in the service, people one by one pour their water together in a large bowl. As the water is added, the person who brings it tells why this water is special to them. The combined water is symbolic of our shared faith coming from many sources.
